## BROOKLYN AMITY SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

At **Brooklyn Amity School**, students can earn three types of diplomas, **a Regents Diploma**, **an Advanced Regents Diploma**. All of these diplomas are valid high school diplomas. All students can earn a Regents or Advanced Regents diploma. An Advanced Regents diploma lets students show additional skills in math, science, and languages other than English. Only some students who meet specific criteria can graduate with a local diploma based on lower exam scores. To earn a diploma, students must earn specific course credits and pass specific Regents exams. \*To note, students who are enrolled in a Regents course will be required to sit for that course's Regents Examination (even if they have already satisfied their regents-requirement for that particular course/subject).
